PROPERTY TAX REFUND APPLICATION DEADLINE EXTENDED TO SEPT. 15



The response to Thornton Township's Property tax refund has been so active that the Township Board of Trustees and I have decided to extend the deadline for application. If you have not yet mailed in your application you'll now have until September 15th to do so.

I have always made fiscal accountability and responsibility the cornerstone of my administration and believe that whenever possible, extra tax dollars be returned to township taxpayers.

While the economy is generally improving, families in Thornton Township are still struggling financially. Many remain unemployed and many are on fixed incomes. We at Thornton Township are working hard under these difficult economic circumstances to address the issues and concerns that matter most to families.

Our food pantry provides nutritious food baskets to over 3,000 residents every month; we provide medical screenings and prescription drug assistance to hundreds of seniors; transportation services to help seniors to go shopping, or attend doctor visits. We provide hundreds of hot meals every month for seniors and help maintain the lawns of nearly 800 elderly residents who can no longer physically complete yard maintenance.

We also have created summer employment opportunities for 100 township youth who otherwise would be sitting idle day-to-day. This year we have also assisted 85 township residents to train for and land quality paying, full-time jobs through our General Assistance Program. Thornton Township families have been doing more with less and that is exactly what Thornton Township has been doing.

We're very proud of our record in providing purposeful services to our neighbors who truly need assistance and we are particularly proud of our being able to do so in a fiscally accountable and responsible way. **That is why the Township can again provide a property tax refund to nearly 45,000 homeowners this year.**

If you own and occupy a single family home or apartment building of six units or less and qualify for the Homeowners Exemption provided by the Cook County Assessor's office, you will receive a tax refund based upon how much taxes you paid to Thornton Township.

However, to receive the refund, you must apply for it through my office. If you have not yet applied or did not receive a tax refund application, please call my office at 708-985-3190.

Remember, the deadline has been extended until September 15th, 2016 so get that refund application in today.

**Senior/Youth and Family Services****Faith, Dignity, and Respect Initiative**

As a part of Supervisor Frank M. Zuccarelli's and Thornton Township's Faith, Dignity, and Respect Initiative, we are hosting a Youth Conference at South Suburban College on Wednesday, August 31, 2016 from 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM. The theme of the conference will revolve around the nationally-acclaimed and evidence-based Law and Your Community training facilitated by NOBLE (National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives).

We have partnered with School Districts 205 and 215. They will "self-select" 200 juniors and seniors from each of their 5 respective schools (i.e., Thornwood, Thornton, Thornridge, TF North and TF South) for an anticipated total of 1000 students.

Facilitators from NOBLE will provide a 2-2 ½ hour training during the conference. This training will provide students with information on the law, their rights, and how best to present and interact with law enforcement, amongst other relevant topics. This

training will, hopefully, serve as an "appetizer" for NOBLE's standard 12 week school-based training program. We understand the value of this and NOBLE's developing Train-the-Trainer program for our students, parents, staff, and community stakeholders.

We are hoping to solicit the support of popular local entertainers and/or professional sports figures to be on hand and participate in the training. We believe that their "buy-in" and presence will have an opportunity to have a profound and lasting impact on our students. Though conversations continue, as of today, we have yet to secure those personalities. Once confirmed, our Media/PR department will be sending out community alerts and press releases. Please stay tuned.

Summer Enrichment Program



Chicago Tribune Highlights Township Services*

Last June Chicago Tribune reporter/columnist Gregory Pratt, spent a day with Township Supervisor Frank Zuccarelli, traveling around the township to witness firsthand and report on the various public services provided by township government in Thornton Township.



"Everywhere Frank Zuccarelli goes in Thornton Township people approach him for a handshake or a hug," Pratt later reported. "At the senior center in Calumet City, where the township hosts lunches and events...outside the township food pantry in Harvey, which is the largest in Illinois...or in Dolton, while one of the township's youth work crews mow a resident's lawn, Zuccarelli greets everyone warmly."


"We really have a great deal of need out here," Supervisor Zuccarelli told the Tribune journalist. "Some of our residents and neighbors have been forgotten and we do things that state government no longer does and municipal and county governments can't keep up with," Zuccarelli said.

Reported On Senior Programs

Pratt's Tribune story reported about the Township's senior transportation program that provides curbside service for a \$1 donation each way – providing transportation for seniors to medical appointments and shopping. The story also highlighted the weekly hot, low-cost lunches for seniors and other social offerings provided.



"Zuccarelli is very popular with seniors," Pratt went on to report and shared a story related to him by a 63-year old Harvey resident living in a facility for people with disabilities. "If it wasn't for Supervisor Zuccarelli, a lot of people would be hurting."



Others were even more assertive, the Tribune went on to report. "Don't ever bad-rap Frank Zuccarelli," 82 year old Arlene Gilbert said. "he listens to seniors, treats us with respect and listens to our complaints and our concerns. Without the township, what would seniors do?" Gilbert concluded.

Nearly 1,000 township seniors no longer physically able to complete lawn maintenance work, can sign up to have the township provide the weekly service for them.

"This is a crucial service we're providing from a couple standpoints," Zuccarelli told the Tribune. "Not only are we helping senior homeowners who can no longer do the work, but in the process are helping maintain neighborhood aesthetics, local property values and, providing summer jobs for nearly 100 township teenagers who might otherwise be sitting idle and maybe getting into trouble."

The Tribune interviewed a Dolton resident, Ramona Jackson who greeted workers with a friendly smile. She said she tried to maintain her own lawn as long as she could but now found it too difficult. She also told the reporter that she really appreciates the service and likes that young people get to see how seniors live. "I think they get to learn about work," Jackson told the Trib.



"In many ways, township government – at least here in Thornton – provides critical, quality of life services that local and county government cannot provide effectively or efficiently," Zuccarelli said. "While the petty bickering and 'politics as usual' continues in Springfield, we need to remember that real people have real needs that aren't being met by state, county or municipal governments. That's why township government is more critical now than ever before. We have hundreds of people we serve every day and we're proud of the work we do," Zuccarelli said.
